Sample assessment material - information for teachers

Assessment Overview

The purpose of this assessment is to allow learners the opportunity to exhibit a range of skills in order to evaluate the nature of the sport and active leisure workforce and produce an assessment of the impact of sporting events.

Time

Learners will have 8 hours to complete this assessment. They should spend approximately that amount of time on the task.

Resources

Learners will require access to information on the local and national sporting events that they choose.

Access to the UK Sport website will be helpful for learners in completing this assessment.

Learners may have access to their class notes and research.

Supervision

Learners must be supervised when preparing and writing their reports including the research on events.

Collaboration

Although team work skills are not assessed through this assessment there are opportunities for learners to work in small groups when evaluating and assessing sport and active leisure events in their local area.

All learners must hand in their preparatory notes and individual reports for marking.

Task One

Select two events to base your report on – one locally and one nationally

You are required to evaluate both events and produce a report containing the following information:

- Explain how the events have a wider impact on associated sport and leisure industries
- Identify the potential economic impact of the events and how this would be measured
- Provide an appraisal of the nature of the roles played by the paid and unpaid workforce required to deliver the local and national sports event
- Analyse the essential training and regulatory considerations in running events and the training requirements for a volunteer workforce
- Evaluate the significance of volunteers to the successful delivery of these sports events, including how sustainable these events would be without a volunteer workforce
